We had a good representation of Chapter 70 Broadcast Engineers in attendance, and it was good to see all of you there! This is a great venue to see some of the latest products in our industry, and while it may not be quite as exhaustive as the NAB, it offered attendees a more intimate one-on-one opportunity to talk with some of the major players of broadcast equipment and suppliers, as there were over 40 Exhibitors set up for the 'Exhibitors Showcase'. Hats off to the OBEC Program Committee for planning this year's conference, which included informative educational seminars. While I attended the Radio Breakout Sessions, I understand the Television Breakouts were equally informative and interesting.

One thing is clear in all of this... staying up to date, on an ongoing basis, with the latest technological advances in Broadcasting has never been more important. The OBEC is one resource. The SBE also offers some great resources to the Broadcast Engineer for learning and obtaining Certification for everything from conventional AM, FM and TV, to the more advanced aspects which include digital and even Computer Technology. While we may live in an analog world with respect to our senses and physical systems, Information Technology has become an integral layer of Broadcast Engineering. Audio and video delivery has evolved in a relatively short time from being sent solely over twisted pair and coax in point-to-point systems, to being networked with use of routers and switches using Cat 5 and 6 cable as well as fiber optic links.
