At our January dinner-meeting, held at Bob Evans Restaurant, Route 77 and Rockside Road, some Chapter 70 members joined the Officers and Program Chairman in a planning session for hosting an Ennes Workshop. Items discussed included convenient location (venue), time of year, day of week, invitation to attendees from surrounding areas, cost for participation,



sponsorship, recommendations for workshop topics and other pertinent details.

Although, it was not finalized, sense of the group was positive to move forward with the planning effort. Several attendees were asked to research individual elements and report back to the group. As of this writing, most action items have been addressed and majority vote favors continuing our efforts.

That being said, the path is cleared to present our findings to those attending our February meeting. It is the hope of

this ad hoc planning committee that membership will concur with our recommendations. As you are aware, the Ennes Workshop is a well-known educational seminar presented three to four times a year covering technical subjects of specific and general interest in support of the broadcast industry. It attracts nationally recognized speakers/presenters from near and far. Locations vary throughout the country. This effort would be a "first" for Cleveland and Chapter 70.

Although a substantial amount of support-effort is required of our chapter, we benefit from the assistance and organizational expertise provided by the National Office for event-planning and topic presentation. Chapter 70's main responsibilities would include "spreading the word" by extending an invitation to statewide and adjacent state educational institutions and SBE chapters; determining workshop registration fees; inclusion of technical topics representing market interest and soliciting sponsorship financial support from local vendors and manufactures. Cleveland Arbitron PPM looses accreditation

Arbitron has been informed by the Media Rating Council that it has withdrawn the accreditation of the monthly AQH radio ratings data produced by the PPM service in five markets: Cleveland, Portland OR, Riverside-San Bernardino, Salt Lake City-Ogden-Provo, and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater.

Nine PPM markets remain accredited by the MRC: Atlanta, Cincinnati, Houston (DMA), Kansas City, Milwaukee-Racine, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Philadelphia, Phoenix, and St. Louis.

The MRC accreditation status in the remaining PPM markets is unchanged. Those 34 markets continue to be unaccredited.

Consistent with our longstanding priorities, we will work to retain accreditation where we have it, to regain accreditation where it was withdrawn, and to achieve accreditation in our remaining PPM markets. As always, we will continue our work with the MRC in order to address its concerns.

Webinar: Ohio radio license renewal is this year

This event will take place on February 15, 2012 at 10:00 AM courtesy of the Ohio Association of Broadcasters.

Ohio radio station license renewals must be filed with the FCC by June 1, 2012.

To assist our member stations in preparing for the renewal process, the OAB will conduct a license renewal webinar on Wednesday, February 15, 2012, from 10:00am – 11:00am.

This webinar – presented by the OAB's FCC legal counsel, Brooks Pierce McLendon Humphrey & Leonard – will fully review the license renewal process, from the pre-filing announcement, filing the renewal application (including the EEO report), and post-renewal announcements. The session will also discuss changes to the application and renewal process since the last renewal cycle eight years ago.

The webinar is offered at no cost to OAB member stations, however <u>pre-registration</u> is required.
