Well HD Radio is still the buzz word of broadcasting right now. The NAB has recom-

February Meeting Wednesday, February 11

Hornblowers Restaurant Gather at 6:30pm

The February meeting of SBE Chapter 70 will take place at 6:30 on Wednesday, February 11, (a slightly different day and time than normal). We will meet at Hornblowers restaurant which is at 1151 North Marginal Road next to Burke Lakefront Airport. We will have appetizers and ice tea at 6:30 followed by a program presented by Cam Eicher of Logitek Audio Consoles.

Logitek is a manufacturer of Integrated Console Routing systems. Their presentation will focus on a new form of studio audio routing and control. He'll talk about implementing a routing system that uses small, local audio routers in each studio location and interconnecting those routers with a fiber optic audio network. Control comes from control surfaces made to look like "Standard" broadcast consoles, automation system PCs or Logitek's

mended that the FCC implement AM HD at night. They state the improved fidelity of the new AM codec should offset any reductions in a stations nighttime analog fringe reception. I think my occasional nights of DX'ing may be about over, I fear AM HD will add too much noise on most channels to be listenable. On a similar note NPR has finished its tests of the Tomorrow Radio Project, sending 2 audio channels on the FM HD radio system. They think it could be a better alternative to current SCA signals and say multipath issues were greatly resolved. I know that my SCA could use a sonic improvement. There is also a review of the Kenwood HD tuner in the latest Radio World that had the author, Glen Clark. listening in Cleveland among other cities.

On another digital note, the SBE has announced the schedule for the Ennes workshops at the spring NAB show, all of which center around IT (information technology). They include sessions on storage architectures and connectivity, aspects of managing content from a service level perspective, the limitations and pitfalls of approaching the broadcast project with standard IT tools, and Middleware - the secret sauce that allows the digital islands to be combined in the IT conversion process. After lunch, William Hayes, Director of Engineering and Technology for Iowa Public Television will moderate the sessions which will turn to case histories and real-world conversion lessons from Clear Channel, ESPN, and Turner Entertainment among others.

that results in an easier to maintain, more flexible facility. Logitek has installed an Integrated

Console Routing system in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. After the program presentation at Hornblowers we will walk to the Rock Hall for a tour of their facilities. There is no way to know what the weather will be like so be sure to wear appropriate clothing for the walk.
